Round Dancing Starts

Dan and Allison Drumheller started a round dancing class June 23rd with 21 Tam Twirlers and dancers from other clubs. Initial plans are to run the class at least until Labor Day on Wednesdays at the Rod and Gun Club from 6:30 to 7:30. If there is enough demand the class may continue after Labor Day. Cost is \$5 per person per class. Even if you missed the first class feel free to come on the 30th as Dan will review the previous week before moving on. Round dancing often occurs between square dancing tips. Non-members taking the class are invited to stay for square dancing and only pay an extra \$5 rather than \$6. Dan and Allison live in Fairfield, cue for the Sacramento Singles, and regularly teach phase 2 – 6 round dancing.

Ideas for the Next Class

Vita Drucker, who just graduated from the last class, has put together six ideas she feels would improve our next class. Here they are with a seventh shamelessly added by your editors. The Board is considering adopting them and is open to any other ideas folks have to keep and motivate students. So if you have a good idea of your own, please talk with a Board member.

1. Milestones

What happens at the end of the first 10 weeks? Students get to sign up for another 10. At this point we often lose half the class. How about recognizing when students have completed something important and are ready to move on to the next phase by creating milestones? After 10 weeks, the first could be as simple as having members form a circle around the students and give a great big, "THANK YOU". Then all dance together. Milestones will help students feel proud as they continue learning and are looking forward to having them eventually join the club. Let's also think about other milestones, such as what we could do at the end of other 10-week segments until graduation.

2. Buddies

While learning, students often have questions about calls or club matters and sometimes feel they just aren't getting it, so let's take a page from college fraternity and sorority pledging – link each student pair or solo student with someone in the club like a Big Brother or Sister. Buddies wouldn't need to wait to be

asked about something but could dance with their student(s) at times, contact them if they haven't heard from them, and as they progress take them to a newer dancer hoedown.

3. Taminations Training

Taminations is an impressive tool. We mention it during class and Brad will show anyone who asks how to use it, but why not give students some formal instruction? Let's take some time early in the first 10 weeks and have Brad show them how it works. Hey, you can slow things down, show dancer paths, keep a call going over and over, etc. How cool! It's a fabulous learning tool and Brad is willing, so let's give them all hands-on training.

4. Newer Dancer Hoedowns

Take students to newer dancer hoedowns when they are ready and willing. We could expand what we did in the last class and coordinate better with other clubs, especially with a September class. When we do it is important to let students know well in advance to coordinate angels and drivers. Buddies (see #2 above) could help here. We might even want to put on a newer dancer hoedown ourselves.

5. Put Calls Taught and Those Coming Up Next on Our Website

Eric did this at the beginning and end of the last class. It worked, so let's do it all the time. Students can review what they just learned as well as see what is coming next. It's particularly important for those unable to come on a particular night or who like to look ahead.

6. Everybody Dance Tip

Let's check with those from the last class to see how they liked it; it seemed to work well because it got more members dancing with students. If so, let's do it when students come on Wednesdays.

7. Get Class Done in a Year

Having a yearly schedule allows better class planning, motivates students more, and helps Eric stay focused. When things drag we lose students and we can't tell interested persons when the next class will start – let's do it!

Setter/Cleaner Uppers

If you can't come on your assigned date, please arrange a substitute and let our hospitality chair, Gen Sheppard (488-1827), know. Those assigned for a given month are asked to bring a treat for party night on the last Wednesday of the month.

Set-up Duties: Arrive by 6:30 pm; get ice promptly from the bar because it closes shortly after 6:30. Fill the cooler, put out cups, snacks, and the marking pen. Heat and light switches are in the back room if needed. If it is still light, wait to turn on the parking lot lights, but no later than 8. Prop open the side door. If tables are set up, stack enough to leave room to dance. Set up chairs around the hall and the caller table on the stage. Set up the hospitality table with the guest sign-in book, member sign-in sheets, flyers, and solo rotation sheet. If it is hot, set out the fans stored in the supply closet room – one in the doorway of the side room and one near the bar.

Clean-up Duties: Empty the cooler, clean up cups and trash. Place flyers and other items in the plastic bin and put it and other supplies back in our supply closet; leave out tables and chairs. If the fans are out, return them and our extension cord to the storage closet room. As you leave, close (but do not lock) all doors.
