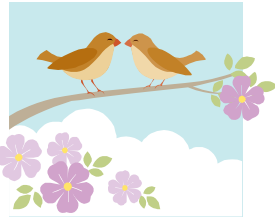

- Some folks grow up in one place and live there for the rest of their lives but not this couple. Along the way he's managed to work for 4 military services in different locations while she has gone from insurance underwriting to teaching and even earning a Masters in Education while in Germany including a ceremony at Heidelberg Castle. They also have a knack for getting places just when something unusual is about to happen.
- They got married 6 months after meeting in a Club Med in Mexico and she then moved from the Bay Area to be with him in Los Angeles where he worked for the VA after an earlier stint in the Air Force. But then he transferred to the Army and it was off to Northern Germany for 11 years for both of them where he worked in social services such as substance abuse while she got a first grade teaching job.
- They were living in Germany when the wall between East and West came down. They also saw the beginning of the so-called "Velvet Revolution" when they travelled to Czechoslovakia in 1989. The future President, Vaclav Havel, was released from prison while

they were there and began the country's movement to democracy.

- Next stop was Albany in southwest Georgia where he worked on a Marine Corps base and she was able to continue her elementary school teaching. They say they found the culture shock bigger between Germany and rural Georgia than they had between California and Germany. While in Georgia surrounded by acres of peanut farms they spent a lot of time kayaking on local rivers and streams there and in northern Florida.
- He hadn't yet worked for the Navy, so off they went to Key West where he helped sailors with relocation and financial assistance as well as trying to mitigate domestic violence. She continued her education work focusing on science this time as well as giving kids additional assistance in reading and math. While in Key West they enjoyed going on cruises but could have done without the all-too-frequent hurricanes.
- On retiring they returned to their roots in California, picking the Bay Area because they had relatives here as well as in Sacramento and Fresno. As chance would have it, her cousin is a Tam Twirlers member and encouraged them to take lessons. They signed up and started at Rod & Gun but true to form finished learning Plus on a trip to Florida's Long Key.
- They even managed to square dance during a New Zealand trip at Rotorua and Christchurch. Not easy because you have to hunt in New Zealand for a square dancing club – they were told that the country's national convention each year attracts all of 200 dancers.
- Activities for both include different types of dancing, hiking, and kayaking as well as taking their trailer all around the West. She also does quilting, knitting, and sewing.
