# **Setter/Cleaner Upper Duties**

When moving chairs or tables please make sure to lift rather than drag them so that no scuff marks are made on the floor.

Check page 4 for dates or the sign-in table at Rod and Gun. Please remember it is your responsibility to switch with someone if you are unable to make your assigned date and then let Jeanice McGee know so she can revise the calendar and remind the appropriate people the day before.
