- When you are a member of the Tam Twirlers, you get the benefit of lower dance fees. Members pay a fixed monthly dues amount that entitles them to all the regular dances, even if there are five dance nights in the month. This cost per night is less than the class rate and even less than the guest rate.
- Becoming a member creates a social bond between you and other members of the Tam Twirlers. You become part of the local community of square dancers.
- As a member of a club, you have a link to other clubs in the local area. Most clubs belong to a regional association, and our affiliation is with the Northern California Square Dancers Association (NCSDA).
- Being a member makes you part of the greater square dance community. As an international activity that is standardized throughout the world, you will have a built-in relationship with other dancers in clubs you visit. You will have friends anywhere you find a square dance.

It is a locally owned and operated pub style restaurant that serves food along with their own hand crafted beers. They have a program called "Iron Springs Public House Give Back Mondays" which is designed to support the local community and for the community to learn about them. Each Monday they donate 10% of all sales from the bar and restaurant between the hours of 4:00 and 9:30pm to local nonprofits, which we are.
