Spend a Week Dancing in McCloud

Dance Country in McCloud offers 5-day packages Sunday thru Thursday in July and August. Dancing is in a beautiful old dance hall with a hardwood floor. Typical schedule is a daytime workshop and an evening dance. Extras include round dancing, picnics, after parties, and pie nights. McCloud is 10 miles east of Mt. Shasta City on Route 89. If you haven't gone before, don't be shy about asking the Carters, Clintons, Kerbys, Marge, June, Meg, or Bill. Callers include Gary Shoemaker, Mike Sikorsky, and Daryl Lipscomb. Lodging tip: if staying at the McCloud Mercantile, check their website first for availability but then call and ask for the dancer special; you'll save a bundle. The McCloud Hotel is also popular.

Other than square dancing and a sometime soda fountain there isn't much to do in McCloud itself – even the dinner train is gone. But nearby are hikes to falls on the McCloud River, fishing, golf, Castle Crags' State Park, and a drive up Mt. Shasta. Farther north is the Oregon Shakespeare Festival – you can even drive there for a matinee play and get back for the evening dance. If new to McCloud, don't be fooled by its 3,000 foot elevation – summer

days are really hot. Square dance attire is requested for evenings only.

See if you can figure out who this month's mystery corner is. Answer is on page 5.

- How many of our dancers can say they have triplets? And, yes, we are taking about boys and girls here, not puppies. Even more amazing, this corner is not a she, but a he. OK, so they are really his grandkids and their mom is his daughter-in-law, but it's still a big event. Two boys and a girl 8 months old now. - To keep mentally active he attends two classes at College of Marin, one on film and one on Russian music, for which he has a special fondness. (He's one guy who could name a few pieces that Ralph Parker would not know!)
- Earlier he enjoyed photography as a hobby and he still likes to travel. One particularly strong memory is seeing the fiords in Norway, although it also reminded him why he left New York for warmer climes in Marin. So who is he?

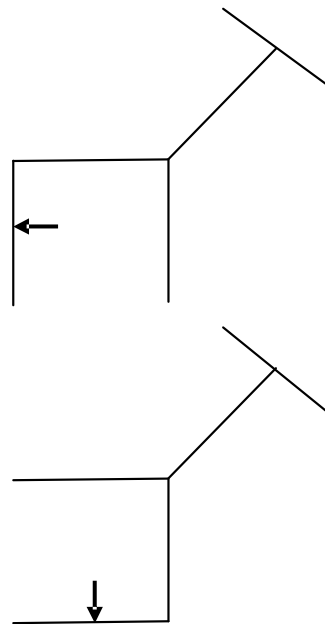

Setter/Cleaner Uppers

If you can't come on your assigned date, please arrange a substitute and let our hospitality chair, Gen Sheppard know.

Those assigned for a given month are asked to bring a treat for party night on the last Wednesday of the month.

SET-UP DUTIES: Arrive by 6:30 pm. Heat and light switches are in the back room if needed. If it is still light you can wait to turn on the parking lot lights, but no later than 8. Prop open the side door. Get ice from the bar before it closes at 7; Fill the cooler, put out cups, snacks, and marking pen. If tables are set up, stack enough to leave room to dance. Set up chairs around the hall and the caller table on the stage. Set up the hospitality table with the guest sign-in book, member sign-in sheets, flyers, and solo rotation sheet. If it is hot, set out the fans stored in the supply closet room – one in the doorway of the side room and the other near the bar. An extension cord is in our supply closet.

CLEAN-UP DUTIES: Empty the cooler, clean up cups and trash. Place flyers and other items in the plastic bin and then put it and all other supplies back in our supply closet; leave out tables and chairs. If the fans are out, return them and our extension cord to the storage closet room. When leaving, close all doors.
